

The original meaning was "gods." Primitively, the upper part was 篇 (see character 零), signifying the meaning of drizzling and also sounding; the lower part in bronze inscriptions was 示 (a sacrificial table), 王(玉) or 心. Only in small seal characters, there appeared a variant form with the character of 巫, especially meaning "a dancing and pleading-god necromancer."
